Court-Approved Legal Notice

If you purchased a **Victor PestChaser Rodent Repeller** in the state of New York from August 29, 2013, until November 17, 2025, a class action lawsuit may affect your rights.

Lawsuit Background

A class action lawsuit known as *Maroney et al. v. Woodstream Corporation*, Case No. 19-CV-8294 is pending in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York against Woodstream Corporation (“Defendant”). The lawsuit asserts that Defendant’s Victor-brand ultrasonic PestChasers do not work as advertised.

Plaintiffs have the burden of proving their claims. The Court has not decided Defendant did anything wrong, and the Defendant denies any wrongdoing. However, if you are a member of the class, your legal rights are affected, and you have a choice to make now.

Who is Included?

Records show you may be a member of the class defined as:

All persons who purchased one or more Victor PestChaser Rodent Repellers in the state of New York from August 29, 2013, until November 17, 2025.

If you are a class member, you must choose whether to stay in the class. If you stay, and money and benefits are obtained, you will be notified about how you can share in any benefits for which you are eligible. If you want to stay in the class, you do not have to do anything now.

Other Options

Opt Out postmarked by December 30, 2025. Submit your opt out if you do not want to be legally bound by the Court’s

judgments and orders. The Court will exclude any class members who request to opt out. Visit the website to learn how to opt out.

Do Nothing. You will be bound by all orders and judgments of the Court, and you will not be able to sue Defendant for the legal claims in this lawsuit.

What’s Next. The judge could decide who is right as a matter of law. If the case is not resolved as a matter of law, Plaintiffs must prove their legal claims at trial. If they win and get money or benefits for the class, Class Counsel may ask the Court for attorneys’ fees and costs. If granted, their fees and expenses will be deducted from money obtained for the class or paid separately by Defendant. You may hire your own attorney and/or attend the trial but you do not have to.
